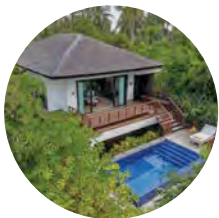

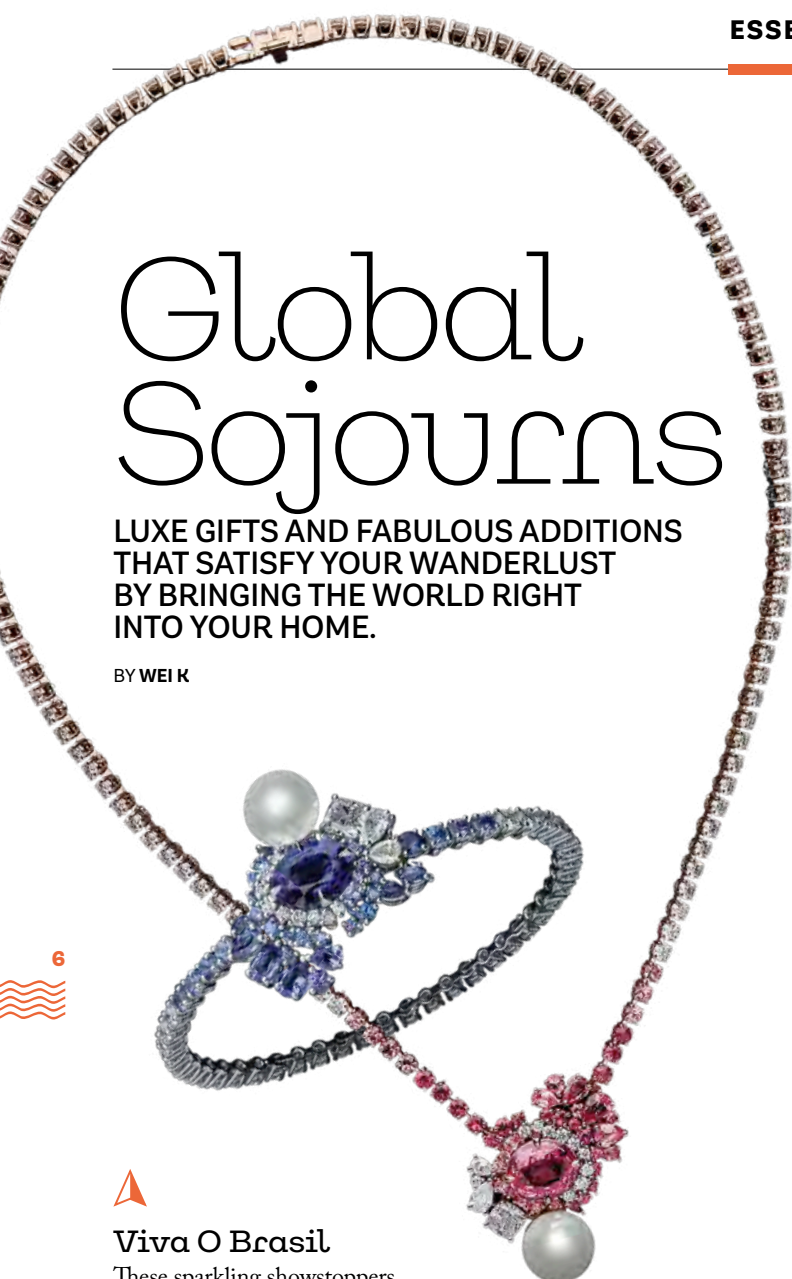

PASSION PURSUITS

FRESH NEW CHALLENGES, THE THRILL OF INNOVATION AND CONSTANT CREATIVITY ARE THINGS THAT SERIAL ENTREPRENEUR MASOUD BASSIRI THRIVES ON.

“You have to have that fire in the belly. That fire is an energy and the source of it is passion—passion about anything that you want to become an entrepreneur for.” That’s Masoud Bassiri’s advice to budding entrepreneurs—as well as his guiding mantra through life.

That fire in the belly for him was always a deep desire to innovate and find creative solutions to problems and issues—fuelled by a curious mind from a young age. “Ever since I was six or seven years old, I used to take apart every appliance in the house, and put them back together,” Bassiri recalls with a mischievous glee at how it used to upset his mother as the appliances were mostly new.

He attributes a lot of his zeal to his industrial-engineer grandfather, who used to take Bassiri and his sister along to exhibitions and expositions—thereby “industrialising” them in their minds when they were just 10 to 12 years of age.

SETTING GOALS

Raised in the state of Indiana, USA, Bassiri graduated in software engineering from Purdue University and began his career writing code for operating systems, which were, back then, just brilliant ideas that were getting jump-started. Then, the telecommunications industry came calling. His stint with Motorola—and incidentally, what brought him to Singapore in 1991—made him part of a team that did the coding for the first and early generation of mobile phones, which set the ball rolling for a string of patents that Bassiri has to his name today.

In many ways, his early career ventures helped uncover Bassiri’s innate nature to always think out of the box. Soon, Bassiri found himself saying “yes” to a role in the American telecom giant’s regional base in Singapore as head of its technical and systems division.

It was a bold call, considering Singapore was completely foreign to him—it wasn’t even on his radar at that time. But that apart, to say Bassiri’s immersion into Singapore was unlike most would not be an overstatement. Bassiri moved to Nortel Networks, becoming part of a team that was responsible for Singapore’s first digital network—and first-time systems of that calibre in the world—as well as the installation of a full mobile network in Singapore. So, if ever you need a lifeline in a quiz competition on Singapore’s telecommunications systems, you know whom to call.

BRANCHING OUT

Singapore was also ripe grounds for Bassiri to start his entrepreneurial journey. “I came to Singapore in 1991. So, quite a bit of the infrastructure you see today was not there at that time. But it struck me as a very well-positioned country with good resources, regional opportunities and engineering talent (some of whom he still works with in different capacities),” he says.

Today, Bassiri is what one would call a serial entrepreneur, having a foot in a variety of industries, including healthcare under Jasper Capital, which he co-owns with friends. In August this year, the company, in partnership with New Jersey-based Angel Medical Systems Inc., launched a one-of-a-kind implantable cardiac monitoring device called

Guardian® system. The device has the ability to detect a heart attack as early as two minutes from its formation, as well as any symptoms of it by initiating alarms whenever it finds any anomalies in heart function.

Four patients in Singapore were the first in the world to successfully receive the implants—renowned cardiologist Dato Dr Leslie Lam and a team at Farrer Hospital performed the medical procedures.

From a purely technical world and profit-based viewpoint to ventures tuned towards saving lives was almost a natural progression for Bassiri. “You know, I’m 57 years old. So it’s not all about profits anymore and how to make returns on investment,” he admits. “Now it’s more like, while we’re making money, can we make a difference?”

In the same vein, there’s a change in direction post-COVID-19 from a predominantly lifestyle focus as well. “It used to be about enhancing the quality of life, but now my venture focus circles around life’s necessities,” adds Bassiri.

When it comes to his personal life, that “necessity” involves taking time to enjoy the good things in life. Today, Bassiri and his wife are also savouring the island life at Sentosa Cove—since their three grown-up children are well on their way to charting successful careers themselves.

An avid golfer, Bassiri spent a good part of Circuit Breaker indulging some of his other favourite pastimes as well—watching movies, savouring good wine and grilling up a storm on his balcony with a view of the yachts in the marina.

“The lifestyle at Sentosa has very unique features. First of all, you have a resort lifestyle. Second, commute to the central business district is just two lights,” he enthuses. And, as one would expect to hear from a self-professed foodie, he throws in a bit of trivia—“most people don’t realise that from VivoCity inwards into Sentosa, there are about 400 restaurants within to choose from.”

“I think a lot about different ideas,” says Bassiri in closing, adding that to his list of favourite pastimes. And that’s proof enough that he is nowhere close to retiring to domestic bliss—an upcoming venture and equally remarkable future launch should prove that. 📧

TIDAL CHANGE

PERSONABLE, SINCERE AND WITH A READY SMILE, SYLVIA NG BELIEVES IN MEETING CHALLENGES HEAD-ON.

It's a beautiful day, and the sight of the yachts at ONE15 Marina Sentosa Cove, glistening in the drizzle, makes it even more so. At the time that I was meeting Sylvia Ng, Senior Manager of ONE15 Luxury Yachting and ONE15 Life, Singapore had just broken out of its Circuit Breaker—which meant that charter-yachts were getting back to business as usual, albeit with safety measures in place. That was reason enough to bring a big smile to Sylvia's already cheerful face.

Sylvia is the person to add to your contacts in the Club if you want to charter a yacht to go around Singapore's Southern Islands. She and her team are in charge of connecting the charter offers of independent yacht owners with your—read clients'—needs and wishes. The division also recently launched luxury yacht staycation packages (more on that on page 14).

Reaching that magical balance of a happy charter operator and satisfied customer, however, takes intense coordination and endless messages back and forth. "We are on our WhatsApp all the time, because we have over 20 different chat groups with all the different boats. I can't afford to lose data," jokes Sylvia.

Now that she has been on the job for over a year, Sylvia is able to make light of it. But when the marketing professional started out, she was moving into completely uncharted territory from a different kind of role at the Gardens by the Bay (GBTB).

"I was one of the pioneer teams—I actually started two days before GBTB opened, so I've seen it when it was actually completely empty," she enthuses. But Sylvia's responsibility there was to find sponsors to support the daily operation and maintenance of GBTB, as well as its various initiatives. So venturing from that to an incentive-based job at the Club was a major shift—like "from land to water", she recalls.

SEVEN-YEAR SWITCH

The opportunity to learn new things and overcome new challenges have always been a draw for the spirited 42-year-old, and motivated her to leave a job she had held for seven years.

Sylvia spent the first few months here learning about the charter-yacht industry with her young (in experience) three-member team.

"There was a lot of learning to do. For instance, many of the

basic rules that are taken for granted in the trade, we have had to learn from scratch," explains Sylvia. "It also took us some time to learn exactly what each yacht can offer, because every boat's pricing tier and offerings, as well as capabilities are different. So we actually have something like a menu for each yacht, detailing their type, size and how much they charge for actual services."

That's easily 40 different products (read yachts)—with 40 different product specifications—she and her team are expertly negotiating with.

But, despite staying on top of things and tying all loose ends, unforeseen mistakes and last-minute cancellations and postponements happen, and Sylvia has to often use her people skills to clear the air. This is where her years of experience in accruing sponsorships come in handy, she says. "It has helped me read people better," she says. "You come to realise that not one method fits all and learn to adapt to each individual person you work with."

Although new to this industry, Sylvia channels the wealth of her past experience into the job. She takes it upon herself to mentor and train her team to be better communicators and sales professionals. "I have a good team. They are young and very willing to learn. In fact, we are all learning together," she says.

And in the process, the team has managed to establish good friendships with the boaters—some of them even bring them Christmas presents.

WORK-LIFE BALANCE

After such high-intensity action every day at work, Sylvia enjoys winding down with a glass of wine with her musician husband. Another thing she finds equally therapeutic is cooking. There's also the



immediate gratification of seeing her foodie teenage son tucking in her food.

But when it comes down to a traditional family meal on Christmas, nothing brings out the holiday spirit at home than steak with Mac & Cheese, she says. Although Christmas was not a tradition that Sylvia followed growing up—as her parents are non-Christians—now that she has her own family, they started a tradition of their own.

That tradition begins with a Christmas tree that Sylvia gets to unleash her “inner artist” decorating.

The family also spends every Christmas Eve at a staycation, and indulge in a buffet lunch—with free flow of wine, of course—to celebrate the end of the year.

“One of the things we would do over lunch is share with one another our highs and lows of the year, and what we wish to achieve in the coming year,” she adds.

That said, living in the moment is equally important to Sylvia. “I’m not a planner. I live day by day. And I try to live every day with no regrets.” 📖

dedicated captain and crew at your disposal. All meals are prepared, as per dietary restrictions specified, and served on-board. Guests can add on jetskis, towable water toys, seabobs and fishing rods to their package if they like. “Yachting vacations are relatively new in Singapore, although they have been very popular in Europe, especially in the Mediterranean area



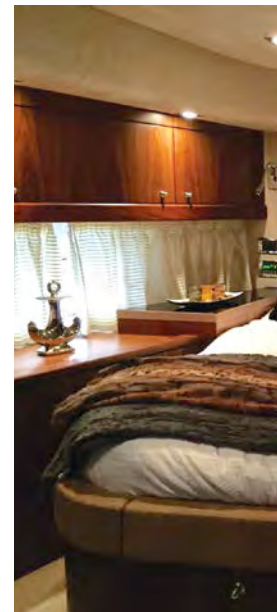

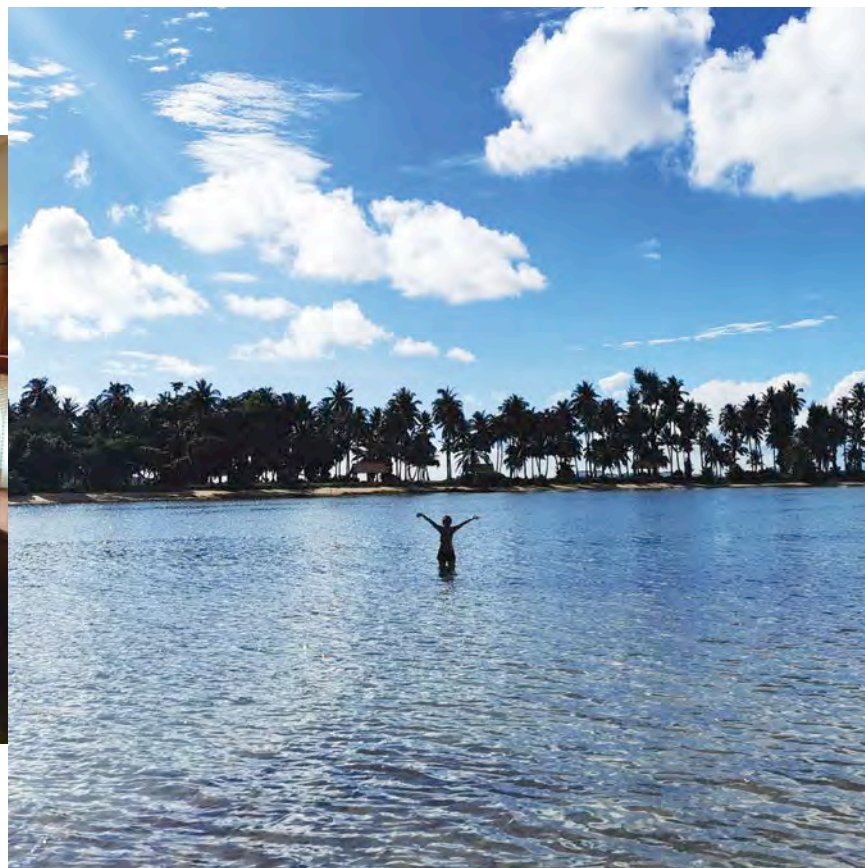

TOAST TO TRADITION

WE EXPLORE THE ORIGINS AND HERITAGE OF THE MOST BELOVED AND ICONIC DISHES TO GRACE THE YULETIDE DINNER TABLE.

The time for holiday feasting is almost upon us, with a flurry of family gatherings, company dinners and festive parties set to serve up all manner of delectable fare. Food has long been central to Christmas, bringing together indulgence, symbolism and tradition in a happy alchemy. After all, what would the season be without the ubiquitous roast turkey served with wonderfully tart cranberry sauce and all the trimmings, sticky sweet honey-glazed ham, and a deliciously rich log cake?

Many of these classic dishes have a storied history. While some can be traced back to pre-Christian times, it is really during the Victorian era that Christmas as we know it began to take shape. In particular, it was English author Charles Dickens who popularised the notion of the quintessential Christmas dinner, complete with a roasted bird and a pudding on the table.

We dive into the interesting history of our favourite traditional Christmas fare—all of which you can enjoy at LATITUDE Bistro at ONE°15 Marina Sentosa Cove this Christmas, paired with their best wines.



Traditional Roast Turkey

One would be hard pressed to find a centrepiece for the Yuletide dinner table that can replace this iconic dish. Essentially, Christmas would not be Christmas without the traditional roast turkey and its many delectable accompaniments. However, as representative of the season as it has become, it was only around the 19th century that turkey became a seasonal staple.

Spanish voyagers first brought turkeys from the Americas to Europe in the 1520s. Turkeys were cheaper to raise than other birds; hatched in the springtime, they grew to sizeable proportions just in time for Thanksgiving and Christmas. They were also viewed as “grand” and a novelty, and started to command a place at banquets and festive gatherings. A 16th-century English poem describes a Christmas feast containing “beef, mutton, and pork, shred pies of the best; pig, veal, goose and capon, and turkey well drest”.

The consumption of turkey really took off in the Victorian era, with the arrival of the railways. The bird became more accessible, and prices fell, helped along by increased production methods and refrigeration. Today, dining on the bird has become a tradition as entrenched in the season as Santa Claus.



FESTIVE PAIRINGS

Opt for a rich red such as *Domaine Chanson Le Bourgogne* or *Il Molino di Grace Chianti Classico* to complement the low-fat, white meat of the bird. Ripe black cherries, liquorice and spices give the former a complex texture with a long finish, while the Italian vintage boasts bright berry and fruity highlights with silky tannins. The *Croix du Marquis Cabernet Sauvignon*, with its fruity notes and soft tannins, is another good option.

FUN FACT

As recognisable as turkey has become on the Christmas dinner table, before the 16th century, people's meat of choice for Christmas was goose, boar's head and even peacock.

Honey Glazed Boneless Ham

Who can resist a slow-cooked Christmas ham, the glistening pink meat bathed in rich golden honey that imparts a whole other dimension of flavour? This sweet-salty staple of the holiday meal has become customary for Christmas, and traces its origins back over 2,000 years to ancient pagan rituals.

Also known as the Yule ham, this dish stemmed from the pre-Christian Norse tradition of slaughtering a boar and serving it in honour of *Freyr*, the God of fertility, the harvest, and boars. Wild pigs were a popular

delicacy at Germanic and Norse pagan feasts. One such Germanic festival, Yuletide—a 12-day, midwinter feast associated with the winter solstice—later evolved to become synonymous with Christian Christmas celebrations when pagans were converted to Christianity. The tradition of eating ham came along with it, and the dish became linked to St Stephen, whose feast day is on 26 December.

In modern times, the holiday ham has undergone a variety of tweaks: some people add ginger beer to the marinade for a bit of fizz, while others up the sugary quotient with cherries and pineapples. Regardless, all result in a delectable cut of meat, and an entrée worthy of a festive feast.

FESTIVE PAIRINGS

Because of Christmas ham's flavour profile, one would do well to choose a vintage with a certain sweetness. Consider these whites: Italy's Piccini Pinot Grigio delle Venezie is a good option with its flowery bouquet and notes of apple and peach, while the medium-bodied Jules Taylor Chardonnay from New Zealand impresses with its palate of currants, citrus fruit, flint and herbs, and creamy finish.

FUN FACT

Ham goes especially well with rock melon and honeydew. Unsaturated fats that break down during the meat's ageing process release chemicals with aromas similar to melons.



Roasted Beef Sirloin

While turkey has become the de facto protein of choice for many Christmas diners, it was not the main Christmas meal until the 1960s in the UK. Instead, a traditional English Yuletide feast comprised roast beef, accompanied by plum pudding, strong ale, ice cream, and tiny biscuits to dip in punch. In essence, red meat, dried-fruit pudding and a good brew were the culinary triumvirate of the Yuletide dinner everywhere in the UK in the 19th century.

Roast beef likely vanished from Christmas menus to a large extent over the years because of increasing affluence, when it became less of a treat and more of a regular weekly meal for many people.

Regardless, besides being the very embodiment of the traditional English Sunday roast, an expertly cooked cut of beef is certainly delicious and eye-catching enough to hold its own at the holiday dinner table. Served alongside roasted veggies and a tasty gravy, this classic British dish is a succulent holiday standout with its caramelised meat sugars and oozing pink juices.

FESTIVE PAIRINGS

A full-bodied Pinot Noir goes well with various beef dishes. The Better Half Pinot Noir from New Zealand boasts vibrant notes of raspberry and plum, with cranberry aromas that lead to subtle hints of chocolate. Similarly, the Jules Taylor Pinot Noir sports an intense aroma of ripe plums and mulberries balanced by savoury and spicy notes. Lovers of French wine might like to imbibe the Chateau La Tour de Mons Margaux: a refined yet profound vintage rich with the flavours of black currant, violets, orange peel and black tea.

FUN FACT

Beef consumption started to take off in the UK around the late 14th century. The salaries of the King's royal guards were even paid in part as chunks of beef, so they enjoyed roast beef every single Sunday—which is why they are called "Beefeaters".





Log Cake

What better way to round off a decadent Christmas feast than with a generous slice of rich log cake? Also known as *bûche de Noël* in France, the log cake or Yule Log is an apt visual representation of the season: this rolled sponge dessert is frosted with chocolate buttercream to resemble the bark of a tree and decorated with marzipan sprigs of holly, meringue toadstools, and other edible embellishments.

Served during the holidays since the 19th century, originally in France and Belgium, the log cake traces its origins to pre-medieval times. In the Iron Age, Celtic Brits and Gaelic Europeans would mark the winter solstice by burning massive logs decorated with holly, pine cones or ivy in their homes. This was also meant to welcome the new spring and purge the air of the previous year's events.

This practice continued even after Christianity made inroads across Europe. Eventually, however, homes and hearths became smaller, and torching giant logs became impractical. In the 19th century, some bright spark then decided to bake a cake in their hearth in the shape of a log instead of burning a real one, and a legendary holiday sweet treat was born. 📖

Christmas in Stockholm is like being in a winter wonderland.

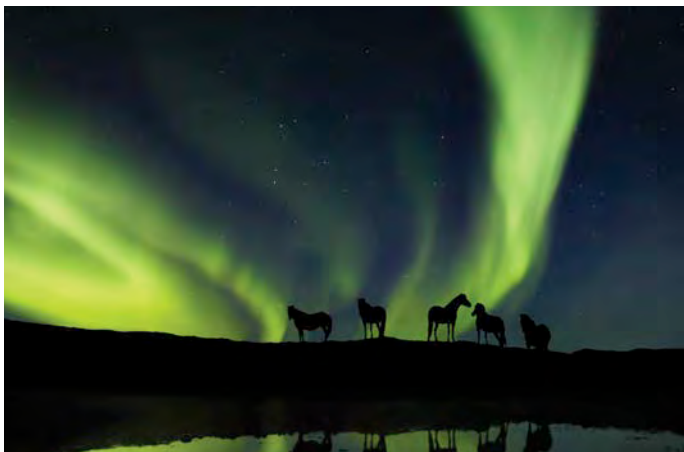


Reykjavik, Iceland

The festive season in Iceland bucks commercialism with its *Jolabokafloð* (roughly translates to “Christmas book flood”) tradition, whereby a preponderance of books are published between the months of September and November. Local bibliophiles typically exchange tomes over the holiday season, and in true wholesome fashion, Christmas night unfolds over literature and hot chocolate. Children place a shoe at their window for the 13 puckish Yule Lads of local folklore to fill with either sweets or rotting potatoes—depending on their behaviour. If you’re not off chasing the Northern Lights over the year-end holidays, try to spot the 13 hologram Santa Clauses hidden around the city. The region is, after all, said to be the birthplace of Father Christmas. For a jolly atmosphere, head to Hafnarfjörður Christmas Village for performances, street food and handicrafts—or comb Hlemmur Mathöll Food Hall for more multi-cultural eats.

PLAY:

Unwind over choice drops in the Members-only lounge at Kjarval (kjarval.com/), overlooking Reykjavik’s main square. Its well-balanced, Scandinavian interiors ooze *hygge*—a quality of cosiness and comfortable conviviality.





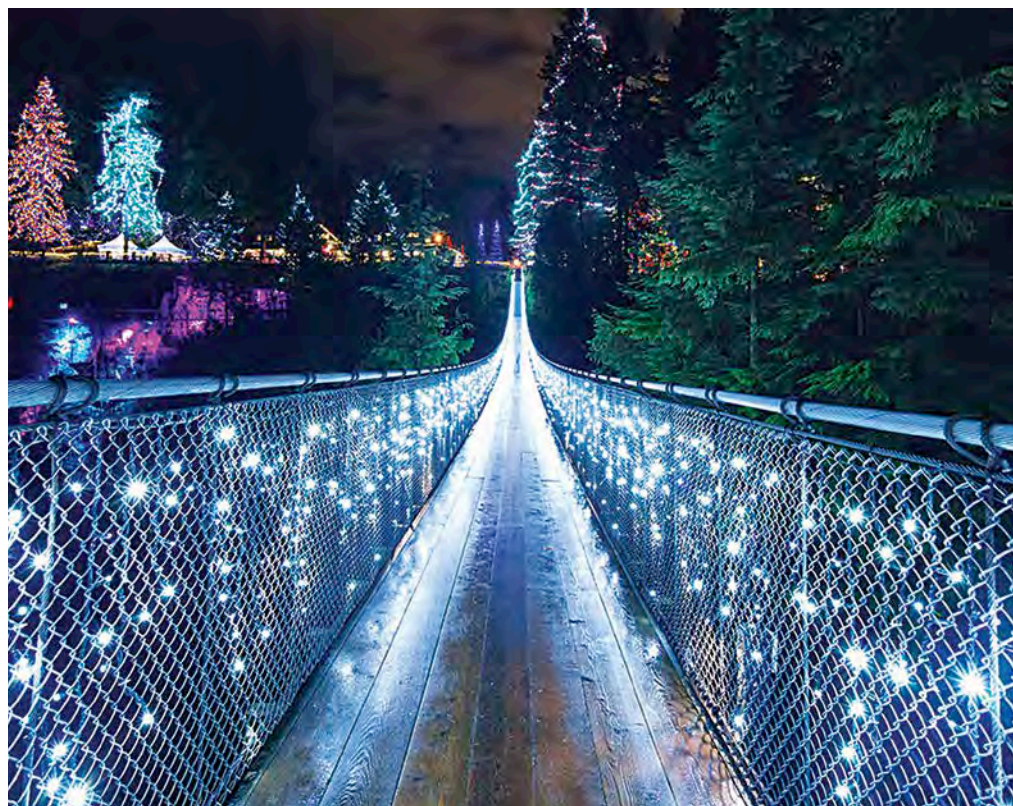

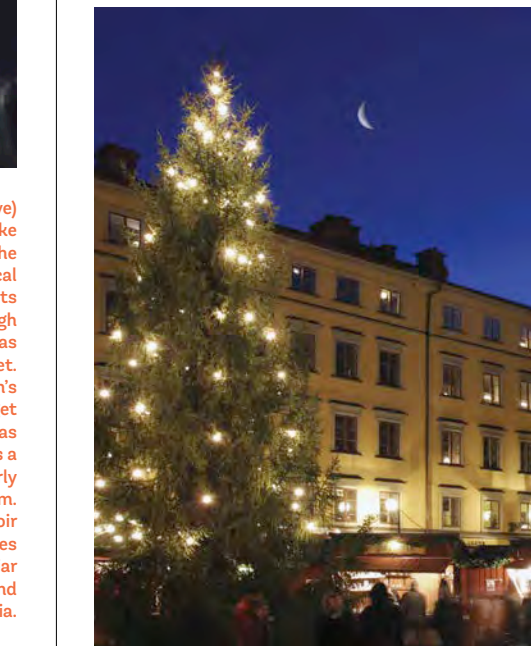
Vancouver, Canada

Canadians, like many North Americans, typically celebrate Christmas with extravagant displays of light and sound, so you won't be short of a sensory treat when visiting over the festive season. Decorations take centre stage, with the exteriors of homes and businesses illuminated by elaborate light installations depicting snowmen and reindeer. While the verdict is still not out on whether large-scale events such as the Santa Claus Parade will take place this year, photo opportunities abound at Canyon Lights at Capilano Suspension Bridge Park. Shimmering across a bridge suspended over river and rainforest, the mesmerising winter lights festival will feature live music performances, a light tunnel, and children's activities. Outdoorsy locals also enjoy winter sports such as ice-skating, skiing and snow-sliding at Grouse Mountain over the holidays, when the area is transformed into a wintry wonderland of ruddy joys.

STAY:

Densely packed Vancouver city is known for its diverse, gleaming skyline. Get front row seats to it when you stay in the sumptuous 650sqft King City View Suite at Auberge Vancouver Hotel. It's part of Terminal City Club (tclub.com), a hub for urbanites with many restaurants and a sky-lit indoor pool.





Edinburgh, United Kingdom

Christmas celebrations have been in Scotland only since the late 1950s, until when they were prohibited—since 1640—following the country's split from the Catholic church decades earlier. Scots began to adopt tinsel-tinted Christmas traditions such as festooning trees with ornaments and feasting on roasted turkey and pudding only after this ban was lifted. They also adapted their own customs, which include burning the twig of the rowen tree at Christmas to dissipate negative feelings among loved ones. A highlight of the season is the Edinburgh Christmas Market (16 Nov to 4 Jan) at East Princes Street Gardens, where a cornucopia of pleasures—from carnival rides, to sausages and potatoes doused in Comte cheese—await. The carousing continues into the new year, where locals mark *Hogmanay* (the last day of the year) with days of revelry. This includes traditional Scottish music at Edinburgh Castle, a massive fireworks display and the Loony Dook on 1 January, which sees individuals in zany costumes making a splash in the icy waters of the Firth of Forth at South Queensferry.

STAY:

For the best of Scottish luxury—complete with plush drapery, tartan motifs and floor-to-ceiling French windows presiding over a well-manicured garden—stay at The Royal Scots Club (royalscotclub.com).

Stockholm, Sweden

In Sweden, *Jul* (Christmas) is amply bundled with the warmth of familiarity—twinkling Christmas Markets set against a breathy backdrop of carolling, and the indignant squawk of a famous cartoon duck. As if that is not whimsical enough, Swedish families huddle together to watch a vintage Disney special featuring Donald Duck and his friends—a special Christmas screening on national television since 1959. Another revered tradition that stretches further back—some 400 years—is Lucia, where candle-toting girls in flowing white gowns sing in honour of Saint Lucia on 13 December. You can catch such impromptu performances in Drottninggatan, as well as a rousing Christmas concert held at 13th-century church Storkyrkan. Soul nourished, proceed to sample smoked sausages, elk meat and mulled wine at the Stortorget Christmas Market in the old town.

PLAY:

Have a *god jul* (merry Christmas) over seasonally inspired drinks at the cocktail bar within Private Members' Club Alma (thisisalma.com).





Manila, Philippines

Christmas traditions in the Philippines display a fascinating intersection between native and western practices. While western mainstays such as mass, carols and Christmas trees have a resounding presence in the former Spanish colony over the Christmas period, Filipinos have also adapted their own colourful customs, including a midnight feast that spills over into the morning. *Noche Buena* is a large open-house Christmas night celebration where friends, families and neighbours make merry over a smorgasbord of delicacies including *lechon* (roasted pig) and sticky rice cakes. This warm, convivial setting is typically framed by a medley of bright colours, as families decorate their homes with kaleidoscopic star-shaped bamboo lanterns known as *parol*. Initially used to light the way to mass, they symbolise the star of Bethlehem that is said to have guided the three wise men to Jesus' cradle. If you want to soak up the festive atmosphere in Metro Manila over the holidays, head to Ayala Triangle Gardens for its neon-lit festival that's popular among friendly locals. Or pop by any mall and hum along with Filipinos to popular Christmas tunes by local musical icon Jose Mari Chan.

PLAY:

Indulge in a sumptuous Christmas meal featuring Peking duck, followed by a spa session at Tower Club Manila (towerclub.com.ph/). The exclusive business club situated close to major malls and hotels boasts a Cantonese restaurant, bar, fitness centre and spa—along with private dining and meeting spaces.

Barcelona, Spain

While the mention of Santa Claus may elicit glee in children across the western world, young Spaniards reserve their excitement for *Reyes Magos* (the three kings), said to be the purveyors of gifts. Locals pay homage to the biblical wise men, whom Christians believe, visited the infant Jesus bearing gifts, through fizzy parades held on 5 January. This two-day long fiesta is enlivened by costumed participants perched on floats, who shower revellers with sweets in a nod to the wise men's munificence. Throughout the Christmas period, the trio can also be spotted amid intricate nativity tableaus adorning Catalan town squares. These hum and ring with festive markets, with the most famous being Fira de Santa Llucia. Set in the shadow of a Gothic cathedral, it's where you can bag unique souvenirs such as friction drums and nosh on *escudella*—a traditional meat and vegetable stew.



STAY:

Soak up history in the opulent, Baroque halls of *Circulo Ecuestre* (circuloecuestre.es), a private equestrian club that dates back to 1856. Rest in the comfort of its cosy, sound-proofed rooms and suites. 📍

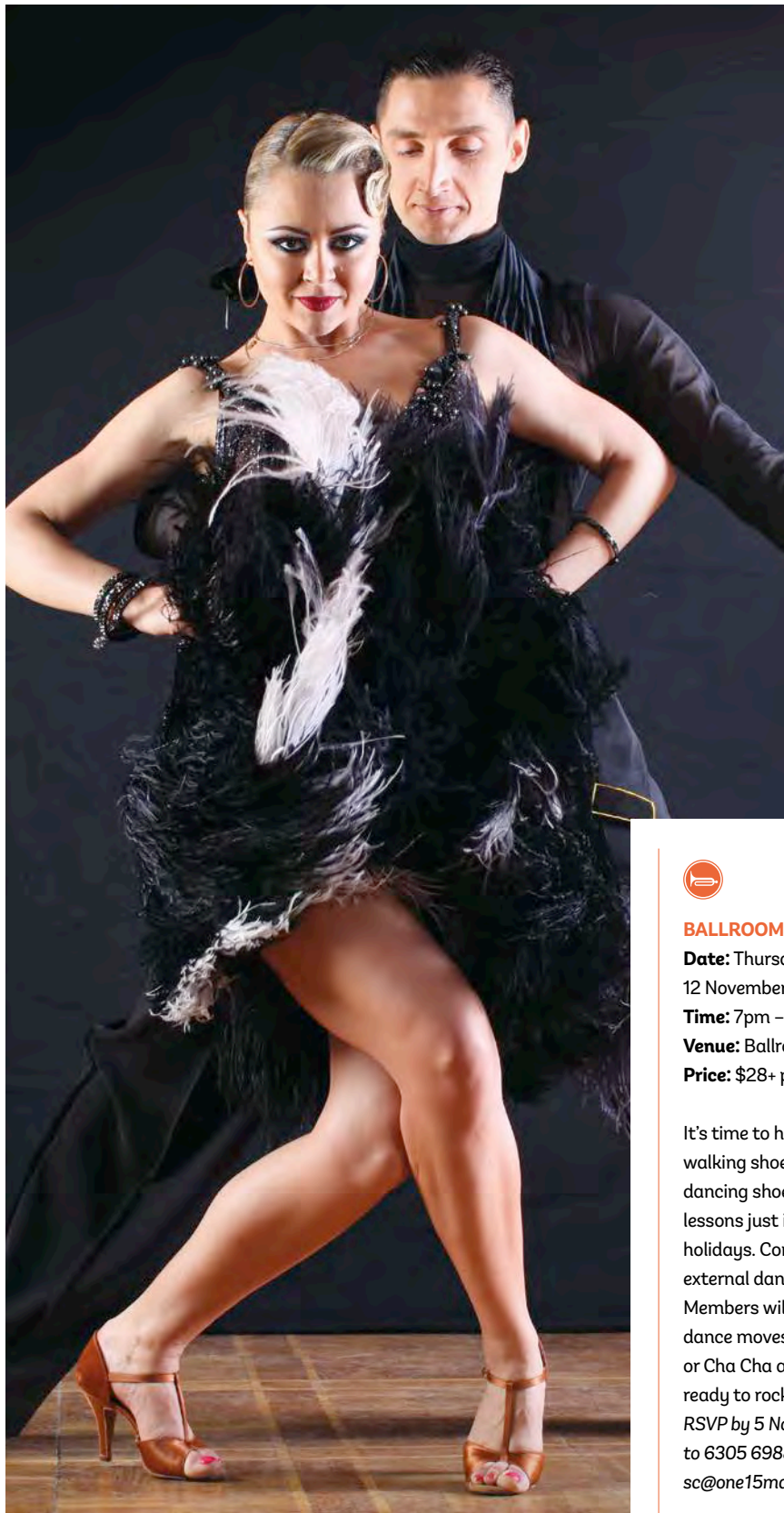

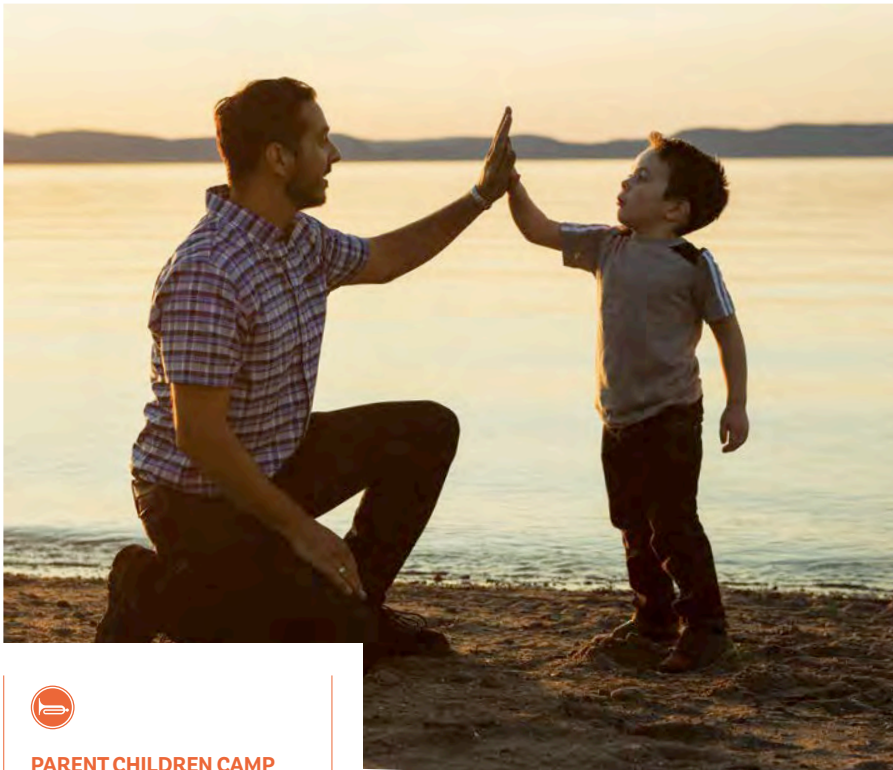

Bag for Good

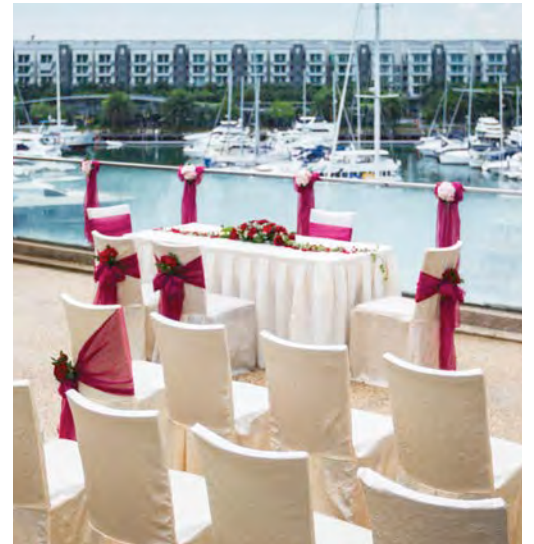

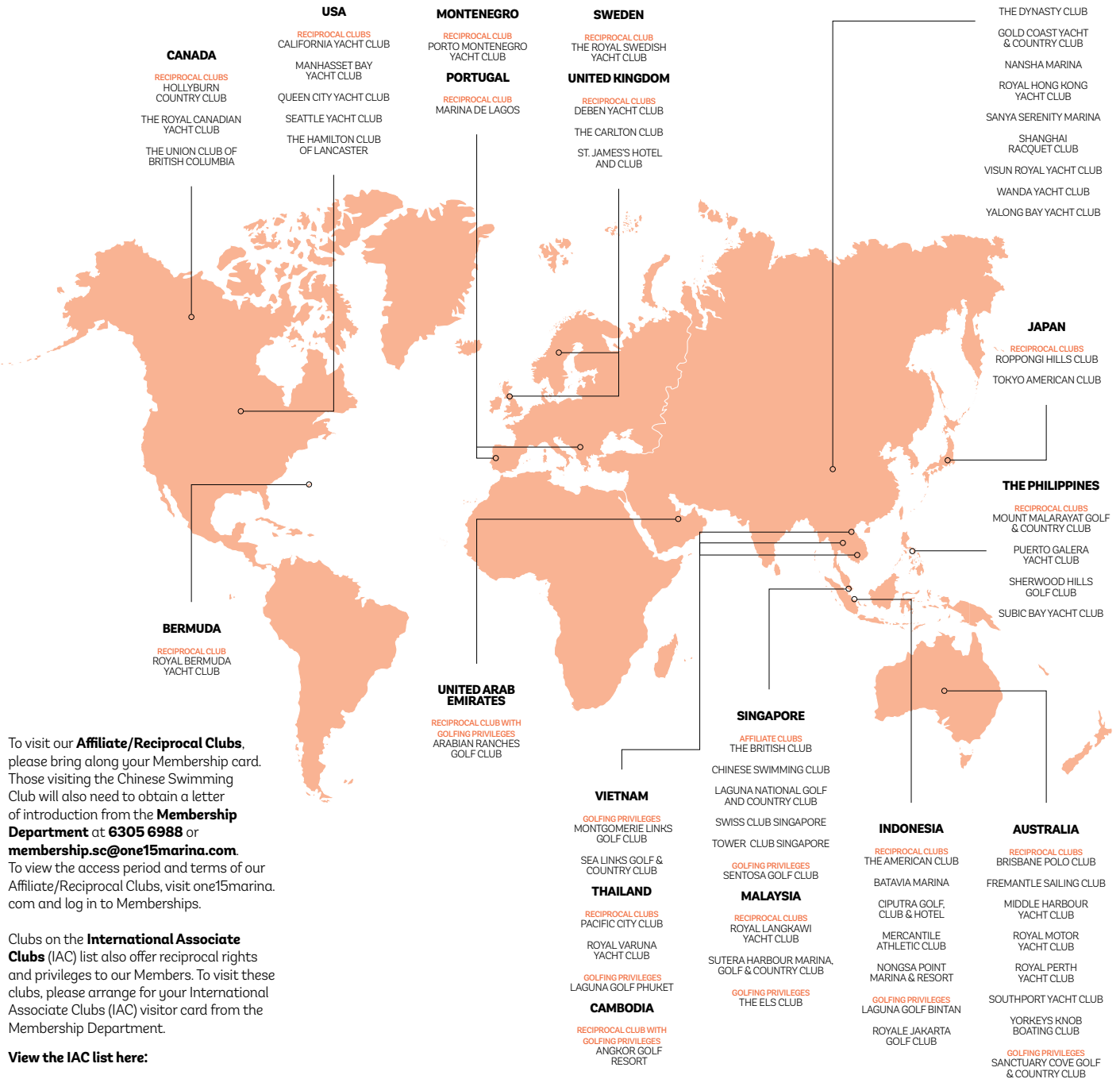

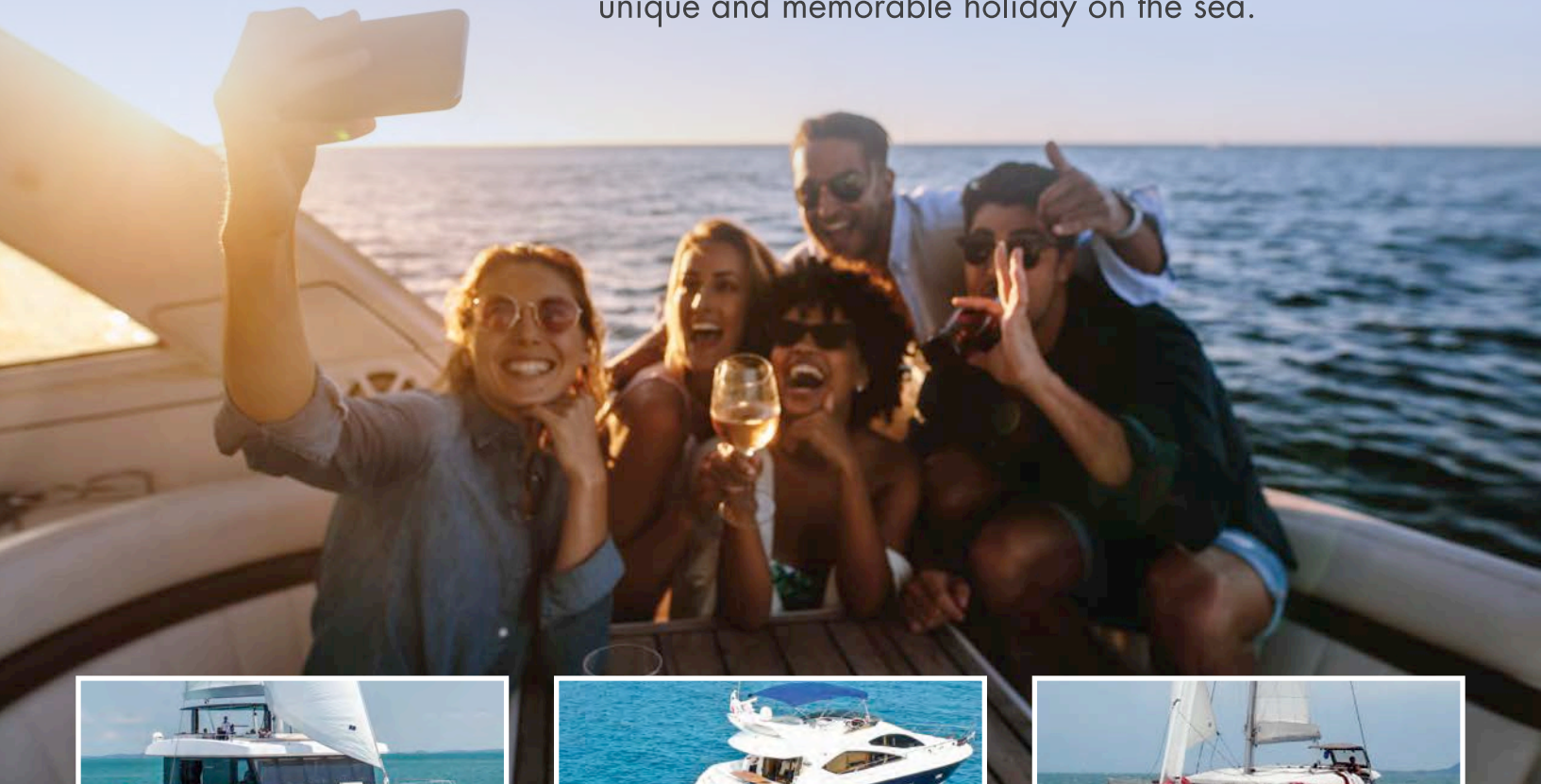
