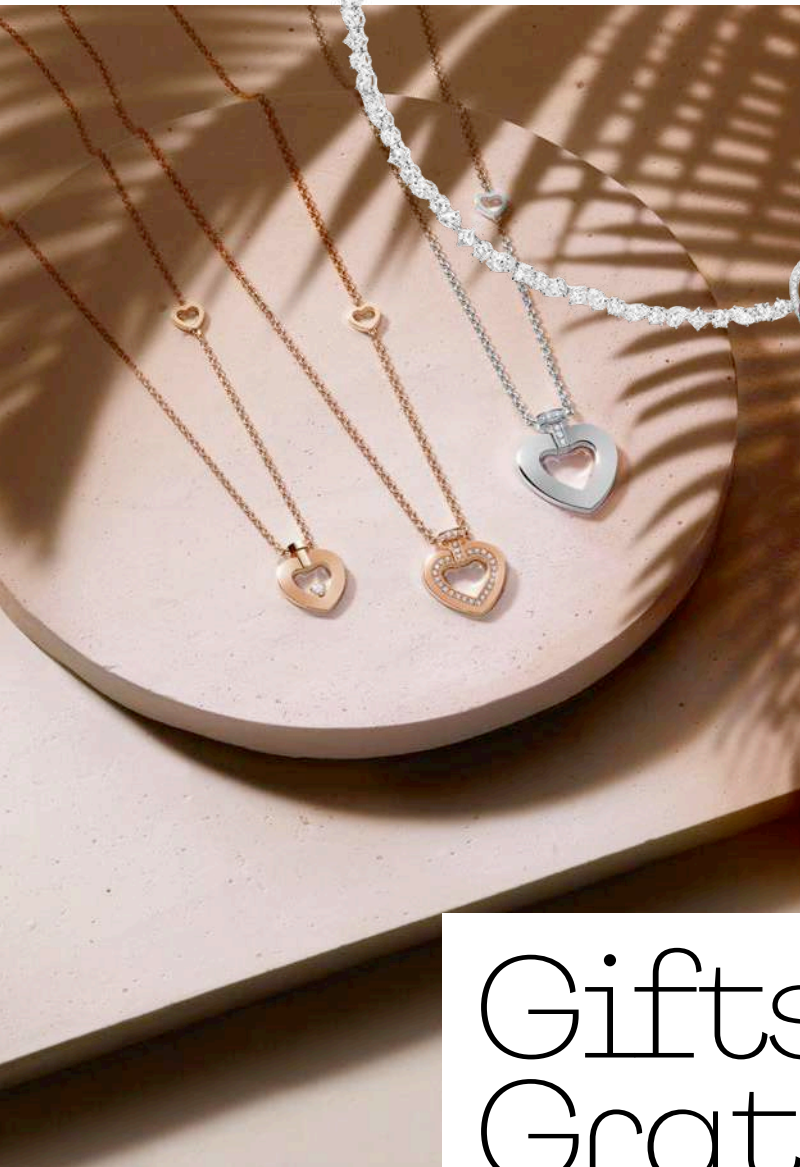

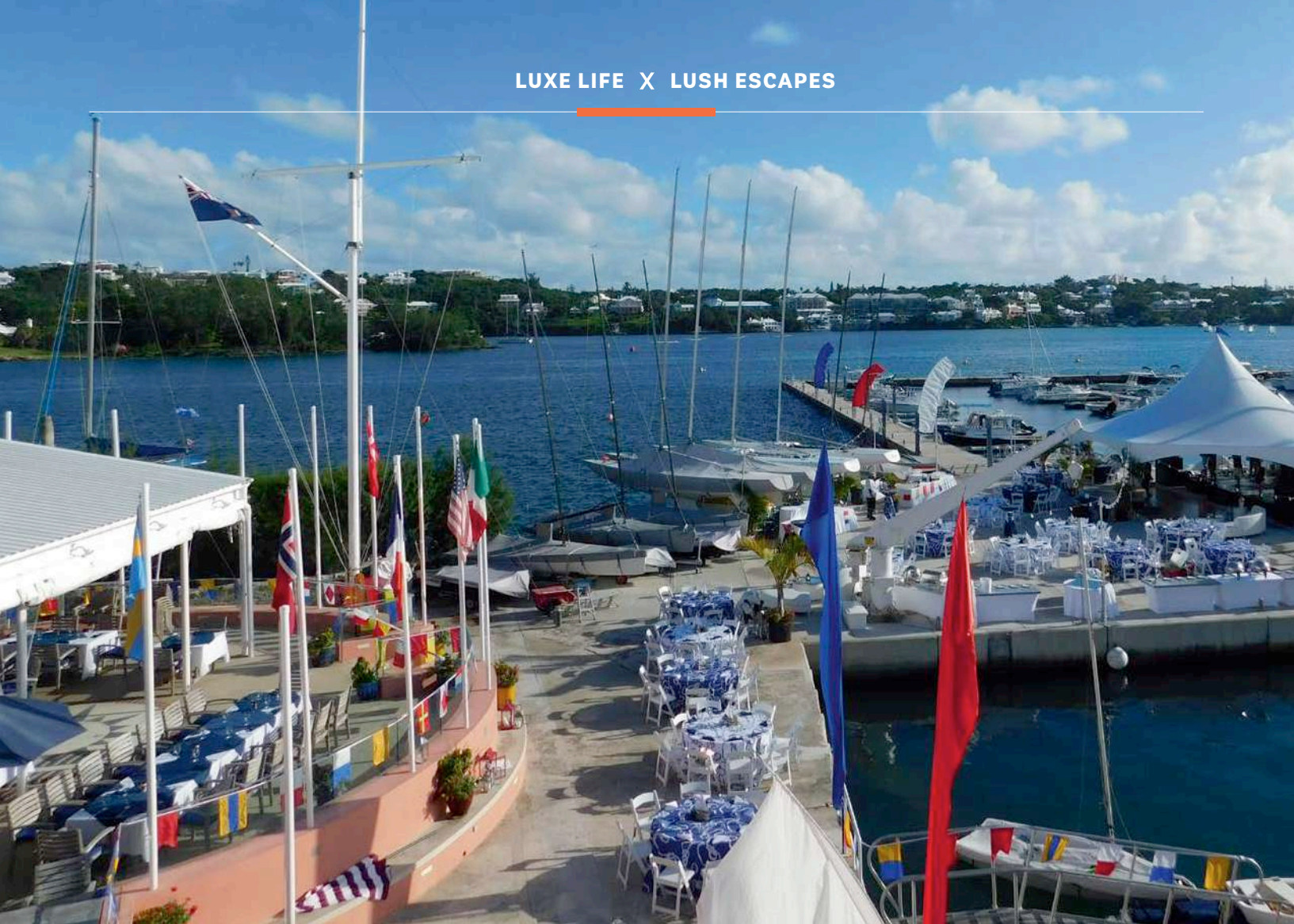

## BERMUDA

### *Royal Bermuda Yacht Club*

Only a small handful of yacht clubs in the world get to tag their names as “Royal”, so The Royal Bermuda Yacht Club (RBYC) definitely owns its place in the history books. The club was born in 1844, as a private yacht club, and a year later, Prince Albert was declared its patron. The RBYC remains till today the oldest royal yacht club outside of the British aisles. Set on the coast of Hamilton, the pink-hued club has hosted many esteemed yacht races since 1926, and continues to do so till today. Visits get extra exciting during competition season, so put that down on your bucket list. The club itself operates year-round, so a visit to the azure waters of the Atlantic, and Bermuda’s blush-hued sunsets are a flight or sail away. Once there, be sure to knock back a couple of the club’s signature, namesake cocktail—it’s world famous.

### PLAY

Bermuda may be small, but it is beautiful. The RBYC is conveniently situated, with easy access to a number of the territory’s top sights, including its pink sand beaches, the most famous of which is Horseshoe Bay.

## TOKYO, JAPAN *Tokyo American Club*

When you think of a club with nearly a century of heritage, an ultra-modern, glass walled block is not what comes to mind. Naturally, the current building isn't the original location. When it was first established in 1928, the Tokyo American Club (TAC) was located in Yurachuko, and was a sanctum for political relations between the West and Japan. It was always described by members as ahead of its time—which is seen cemented in the current design of its Minato City compound. Expect state-of-the-art amenities here, levelled up—from a 25m pool with views of both the Tokyo Tower and Mount Fuji, to an in-house bowling alley and art gallery. Make time in your stay for an evening at The Vista, a European-style salon bar suffused with the lights of the Tokyo skyline. The selection of cask-seasoned cocktails here epitomises the simple elegance of Japanese bartending, while the wine list is lined with careful selections from sommeliers.

### PLAY

Minato City is where Roppongi also resides. The Tokyo City View is one to add to the itinerary. For a cultural day out, visit the Mori Art Museum, a multidisciplinary museum with modern art from around the world.

## LONDON, ENGLAND

### *The Carlton Club*

Stand in front of its stone and brick facade, and find yourself transported back to the 19<sup>th</sup> century, when the club was first founded as a stronghold for the Conservative Party. While the club's exterior is distinctly Georgian, its architect wanted touches that nodded to ancient Greece and Europe—the regal Grecian columns stand testament to that. The interior is a blueprint for Regency-era decor: the towering imperial staircase that greets you and the many luxe spaces that take you through a journey of the world's archives.

Though The Carlton Club began in 1832, it has relocated multiple times before settling at its current address, having weathered conflicts and world wars.

The Carlton Club's legacy may have dark marks in its footnotes, but the establishment triumphs as a homage to the tenacity of art and architecture. Many of the paintings that adorn the walls were rescued from the rubbles of club venues past, and remain, ready to wow members for centuries to come.

#### PLAY

Aside from a roster of gentlemen's clubs like The Carlton Club, St James's Street is spotted with luxury boutiques that span men's fashion and grooming. Be sure to make an appointment at the original Truefitt & Hill, the oldest barbershop in the world, where you can get a cut, shave, and a shoeshine all in one sitting.

## VICTORIA, CANADA

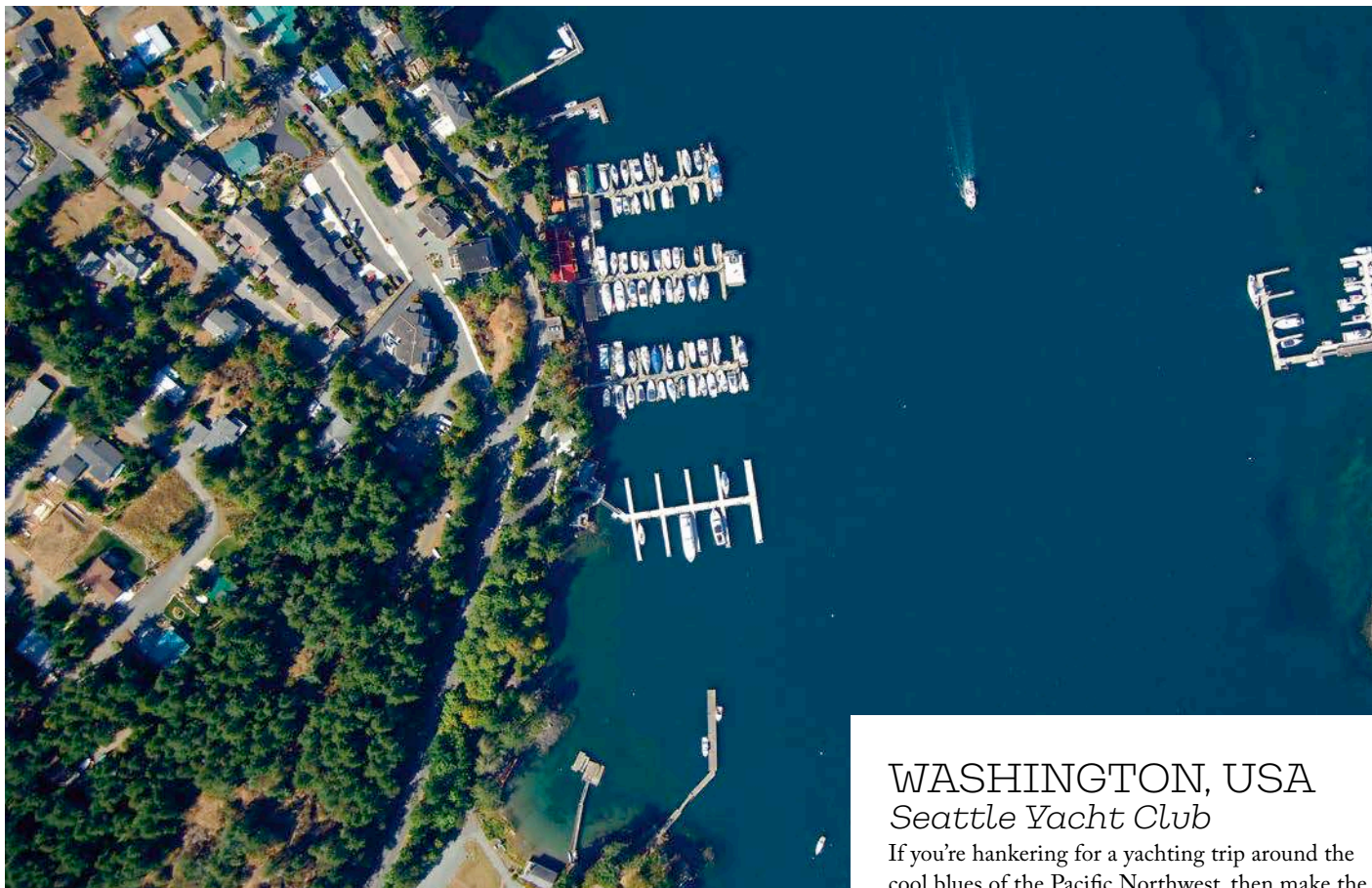
### *The Union Club of British Columbia*

Of all the unlikely places a members-only club could begin, a butcher's shop comes up tops. Still, The Union Club of British Columbia's (UCBC) less traditional beginnings in 1879 didn't stop it from becoming one of the leading gentlemen's clubs in Victoria, with some of the most notable names in national history gracing its membership roster. The club's very first president was a renowned judge and colonial official, knighted by Queen Victoria. Explore the archives and you'll find that some were mayors of Victoria, prominent military figures, and captains of industry. Enter the UCBC and you're retracing the steps of the Canadian *crème de la crème*. The awe-inspiring club decor packs a visual punch, starting with its Gregorian facade. The grand lobby looks straight out of a period film, with its 20-ft ceilings and rich mahogany accents. Take your time to explore the art collection, particularly in the Past Presidents' Library, where painting and rare books that date back to 1885 adorn the shelves and walls. Dining at the club, on the other hand, opens one's eyes to local and sustainable Canadian produce.

### PLAY

Victoria offers many stunning cultural monuments for its visitors to explore, but an evening at the Royal Theatre should be at the top of your itinerary. The 1,434-seat theatre is home to the Victoria Symphony, and Pacific Opera Victoria, as well as a playbill of local performers and troupes guaranteed to entertain.





## WASHINGTON, USA

### *Seattle Yacht Club*

If you're hankering for a yachting trip around the cool blues of the Pacific Northwest, then make the Seattle Yacht Club (SYC) your port of call. Over 120 years have gone into moulding the SYC as one of the oldest surviving yacht clubs on the West Coast, and today, the club doubles as a nationally minted heritage destination. Take a stroll around the club's grounds for a visual 101 of colonial American architecture—from the white-board, red-roofed club buildings to the lighthouse tower, each picture-perfect detail shows how far the club has come from its early days—as far back as 1892—as a rickety boathouse. Another reason the SYC is so important to the maritime history of the Pacific Northwest is its cred as the preferred club for world-class sailors and rowers, even Olympic champions. Also, the restaurants on-site offer some of the finest dining experiences you can get in the area, particularly if you're keen to sample Northwestern produce. 🍷

### STAY

The Lake Union area is quiet, but worth exploring for its verdant parks. You have plenty of choices for daytime treks or family picnics, such as Sunset Hill Park, which overlooks the Olympic Mountains. Make a pitstop at the Seattle Asian Art Museum, situated in an art deco building from the 1930s.

# CAPTAINING A NEW CHAPTER

---

**RICHARD EU, THE NEW NON-EXECUTIVE CHAIRMAN AND INDEPENDENT DIRECTOR OF SUTL ENTERPRISE, IS ALL SET TO STEER ONE°15 MARINA SENTOSA COVE TOWARDS A NEW HORIZON.**

## “STANDING STILL MEANS YOU’RE GOING BACKWARDS BECAUSE EVERYONE ELSE IS PROGRESSING.”

The last time I saw Richard Eu was in Switzerland. I had bumped into Richard, one of Singapore’s most distinguished business figures, outside the Olympic Museum in Lausanne in November last year, shortly after the Vaccinated Travel Lane had opened.

We were garbed in heavy coats then in the chill of winter, a charming contrast to this gorgeous sunny day back in the tropics on the marina. It’s a distinction as delicious as the juxtaposition between the public persona and pedigree of the businessman behind the Eu Yan Sang empire and the scion of one of Singapore’s earliest tycoons, Eu Tong Sen—and the passionate musician and a self-professed rebel at heart.

Here we are sitting in LATITUDE Bistro in ONE°15 Marina Sentosa Cove, as Richard was appointed the new Non-executive Chairman and independent director of SUTL Enterprise, which runs the marina, on 31 December 2021.

“I’ve been a Member of the Club since the beginning—I was on the advisory board from the start in 2007. So, I’ve seen it grow from the ground up and I know the Club well,” shares Richard, who has taken over the reins from previous non-executive chairman Lew Syn Pau.

### A FAMILY AFFAIR

Richard’s close and long-standing relationship with the water goes back to his youth. He was one of the founders of the Singapore Water Ski Federation, established in 1978. It has since been renamed the Singapore Waterski and Wakeboard Federation. An avid water skier, he had represented Singapore in the Southeast Asian Games in 1983, even taking home a bronze medal.

“I’ve been a boater for most of my adult life, interested in small boats mostly,” he says.

In the past, Richard had owned a series of water skiing boats and the largest vessel he once owned was a 42 ft cruiser named *Arrow*, which he bought second-hand and later sold off in the 1980s.

“We have the sea and sun and good weather all year round so I’ve always promoted the idea that we should take advantage of these temperate and geographical advantages that Singapore has,” he says.

Boating, for the Eu clan, has long been a favourite family pastime—and looks set to continue with the next generation.

“Our family is at a stage where the next generation is coming along and I now have a granddaughter. Boating is a fantastic family activity. About once every month or two, we charter a boat or find friends with boats and take a boat out with the kids on the weekends,” he shares.

Apart from going out to sea, Richard visits the marina almost every weekend. “I like being close to the water; it’s like being away from Singapore,” he offers candidly.

### DRIVING FORCE

In addition to being out on the open sea, Richard also loves being out on the open roads, and is quite the car and racing enthusiast.

“I love cars. I’m a bit of a Jaguar fan. I’ve had different models over the years, including sports ones, and I’m currently on my fourth Jaguar XJ,” he says.

Back in the day, Richard owned a Honda S600, which he would race in competitions. “It was a tiny little car with a tiny 600cc engine but it went like crazy,” he recalls, with a hint of glee. Now that the age of electric vehicles is here, “I might consider owning a Kia EV6 GT in the future”.

Another dream of his is to follow in his grandfather’s footsteps and one day own a vintage car.

“My grandfather loved cars too. And one year, I got a strange request that a guy in Austria wanted to connect. It turns out he had purchased a 1924 Rolls-Royce and had traced the provenance—he ended up owning one of my grandfather’s cars and invited me to Austria to visit, which I did with my son one day.”

### CHARTING A NEW COURSE

In his new role at SUTL Enterprise, Richard will be developing ways to grow the company, as well as the marina.

“Standing still means you’re going backwards because everyone else is progressing,” he notes.

“The ONE°15 Marina brand is already well known. I think that there may be further opportunities in building up lifestyle businesses using the brand.”

Recalling a time when having a marina in Singapore was but a faraway dream, Richard adds: “Although ONE°15 is not the first marina in Singapore, because of the CEO Arthur Tay’s vision, it has become the pre-eminent marina in this part of the world. And to see the recognition of boating culture fully entrenched within Singapore is very satisfying.”

“Forty years ago, I never thought this was possible, and I’m glad to be part of that now.”

## RICHARD’S TOP 3

### MUSIC

“I like music and I’ve been in bands from my college days. I have a six-piece rock band called Cat Mountain Kings, which we started about 20 years ago. I’m the lead vocalist and play the blues harmonica. We used to play gigs at pubs and for charities and at music festivals, and we played as far afield as Thailand and China before the pandemic. It’s amazing to get into the groove and feel that connection with your fellow musicians and the connection with the audience.”

### PET PEEVE

“Bad driving. There is a lot of room for improvement in road etiquette in Singapore. If drivers can be more polite and considerate, our roads will be much safer and journeys will be more pleasant. I also worry about the lack of bicycle lanes.”

### LIFE LESSONS

“You’ve got to have a life. Don’t spend your life trying to chase academic qualifications. Study, but also layer upon that an ability to think critically, which a lot of times is lacking. We’re not living in the 19<sup>th</sup> century anymore; the world is not a factory floor, and we cannot produce clones with no initiative.”



# THE RIGHT PLACE

Sitting at LATITUDE Bistro, Yully Effendi presents a pretty and sprightly picture. Her breezy exterior does little to belie her gutsy and spirited persona. “I am someone who is open to challenges,” says Yully who joined ONE°15 Marina Sentosa Cove as its new Membership Director in September last year.

As someone who had established herself in the banking industry, Yully was surprised when a headhunter called her with a very different proposition—about a certain job in ONE°15 Marina Sentosa Cove. Although, it was for a position and industry that was new to her, Yully didn’t even have to think about it. In a very *Jerry Maguire*-sque scenario, he had her at the mention of the company’s name.

### RELIVING HER CHILDHOOD

“At my current age, I think when you actually switch careers, what really matters most is whom you’re going to be working with, and the company’s mission and vision,” says Yully. This was affirmed after her conversation with the Club’s General Manager, Jonathan Sit, and the Group General Manager Teo Joo Leng—“I knew that this was the place that I wanted to join”.

Growing up in Indonesia, the marina was Yully’s playground—her dad started his foray into the world of business in the shipping industry. “My dad loved the marina,” she says, getting emotional at his mention, having lost him two years ago. “I am from Bintan, where you can find houses built on the ocean, and the pontoon is actually the ‘road’ leading to them, so this reminds me of my hometown and my dad—it is quite special to me,” adds Yully.

But the value that she brings to the Club is more than just a sentiment. Yully brings with her more than

a decade of experience in the banking and finance industry. “I definitely speak a different lingo, but what connects my past experience with the work that I do here is the high net-worth clientele. Coming from the finance industry, I am able to bring a different perspective,” explains Yully, aided by her innate ability to think out of the box.

### SPREADING HER WINGS

As thrilled as she may be about the serendipitous twist of events that got her this role, Yully is not oblivious to the challenges—especially terminology that she has never encountered before. “But I am a fast learner,” she says in a low voice, recalling her first stint in Singapore’s banking industry. “They put me in a neighbourhood branch—in Ang Mo Kio. I didn’t speak a word of Mandarin, and I was in a branch catering to clients who spoke a very different lingo.” It was a culture shock, but Yully not just got over it very soon, she gained recognition and won awards for her achievements.

She puts it towards the international exposure she has been lucky to have—she studied in Australia before moving in 2005 to Singapore to be closer to her family. Also, her forte in international business took her around ASEAN, India and more. “It made me very independent and versatile. I often tell my friends to send their children overseas if they can. They just have to adapt,” she says.

Getting past trials and challenges are more than a tick-box exercise for Yully—it’s also intrinsically linked to her desire to excel in her job. She proved it in February in the midst of the Club’s preparations for the SB20 race. Yully managed to hop on to an SB20 fun race at the eleventh hour when a spot became available—it was so impromptu that she had to borrow shorts and t-shirt from housekeeping. The ‘challenge’ here? Yully suffers from extreme motion sickness. “The weather was moody when we started out and we got caught in a storm before we came back ashore. I was completely drenched, but the good thing is that we survived—I actually liked the feeling,” she says.

“One of the reasons I wanted to do that is because I’m in this Club. I want to know what we can offer and experience it myself so I can share it with our Members.” Yully’s success at her career has been this ability to stay one step ahead, and for now, her heart and feet are firmly where she wants to be. ✂

# CULINARY COMPASS

SAVOUR TRADITIONAL CHINESE CREATIONS THAT HAVE BEEN PASSED ON THROUGH GENERATIONS AND STILL REMAIN MAINSTAYS.

Recall the iconic dumpling making scene from *Crazy Rich Asians*? Besides the opulent settings and high-fashion in the room, the underlying message of a family tradition not just made it endearing, it was an unintended leveller. These adherence to nuances and traditional processes help keep culinary styles alive.

Traditional Chinese dishes require painstaking preparations to ensure the recipes are perfectly executed. Cooking techniques that are often used range from double-boiling and steaming to braising and roasting. A highly experienced chef will be able to treat fresh quality ingredients with respect, as

well as coax out their natural flavours using the best methods.

At WOK°15 Kitchen, Chef Chum Kar Ho who has 45 years of culinary expertise is a master of traditional Cantonese cuisine. The chef who's worked at reputable restaurants in Hong Kong for 20 years followed by several celebrated establishments in Singapore aims to push the boundaries in Cantonese cooking and excite palates with the freshest quality ingredients and finest flavours. We find out how the chef and his team prepare some of these authentic Chinese creations that have been relished for generations.



## Braised Spinach Bean Curd with Trio of Mushrooms

Bean curd first originated in China's Han dynasty (206 BC – 220 AD), and has been enjoyed for over 2,000 years. It however didn't become widely popular until the Song dynasty (960 – 1279). Today, different Asian cuisines feature the delicate protein-rich tofu. In Japan, tofu was first introduced during the Nara period (late 8<sup>th</sup> century) by Zen Buddhist monks, who called it 'Chinese curd'.

Although a variety of processed bean curd is available these days, some restaurants still prefer to

prepare their own rendition. WOK°15 Kitchen's Braised Spinach Bean Curd with Trio of Mushrooms (below) showcases the chef's authentic handmade bean curd made with eggs combined with black and yellow soy bean milk. The kitchen team rustles up this dish from scratch to ensure freshness and quality. To retain the flavour and texture of the spinach, the vegetable is chopped by hand till very fine, and carefully place on top of the tofu, and then steamed for half an hour. Before serving, the bean curd pieces are deep-fried and served with spinach, mushrooms and oyster sauce.

### FUN FACT

Tofu originated in Shouxian County of Huainan City in Anhui Province, eastern China. Over the past 2,000 years, locals of the 'hometown of tofu' have been dedicated to passing on the technique of making tofu—which was listed as a national intangible cultural heritage in 2014.





## Double-boiled Chicken Soup

Double-boiled soups are traditionally prepared in many Cantonese kitchens especially in China's Guangdong or Fujian provinces. This technique is a slower and gentler process compared to straightforward boiling. It is usually used to prepare delicate foods such as bird's nest soup, hashima, or nourishing Chinese tonics. This method extracts the flavour of expensive ingredients without compromising on their flavour or texture.

The ingredients (alongside water for the stock) are placed in a small ceramic pot or jar. Specially designed double-boiling ceramic pots are traditionally made

of Yixing clay, which conducts heat slowly but has excellent heat retention. This is then placed in a larger pot of boiling water or sometimes in a steamer, and simmered for several hours. This traditional Chinese pot-in-pot cooking technique ensures that there is no loss of liquid or moisture from the nutritious ingredients. At WOK°15 Kitchen, Chef Chum slowly double-boils sakura chicken (above) for about four hours together with Chinese herbs, red dates, and a special ingredient called Tian Shan Snow Lotus. The chef says that this prized snow lotus is found in the snowy mountains of Tibet.

### FUN FACT

The concept of double boiling is similar to *bain marie* in French cooking. Double-layered pots are used to cook foods with indirect heat. The *bain marie*'s origins are said to trace back to the days of ancient Greeks who used double-bottomed amphoras to prepare delicacies.

## Eight Treasures Duck

Eight Treasures Duck or babao ya is a well-known dish in Shanghainese cuisine. Served at well-established restaurants in the city, the creation is often enjoyed on special occasions like Chinese New Year Eve.

Traditional ingredients used for the stuffing include glutinous rice, ham, shrimp, bamboo shoots, chestnut, green soy beans, dried scallop, chicken (meat and gizzard), and shiitake mushrooms.

“I have tried the babao ya in Shanghai—their style tends to be a bit dry,” says Chef Chum adding that his version at WOK°15 Kitchen counteracts the dryness with a special sauce.

Over in Hong Kong, this labour-intensive dish became a famous banquet dish in the 1930s. For the Cantonese rendition, after the duck is stuffed with eight stir-fried ingredients, it is cooked in a chicken and soy broth for over an hour, resulting in ultra-tender meat.

Essentially, it requires a very skilful chef to prepare this recipe as it involves a long and tedious cooking process. Chef Chum says that the first step is to remove all the bones from the duck while keeping the entire bird intact. The stuffing consisting of glutinous rice, Chinese sausage, chicken cubes, conpoy, cured ham, dried shrimps, salted egg yolk and wild mushrooms is stir-fried till fragrant. He fills all the ingredients into the duck's stomach, and then deep-fries the whole duck so that the skin doesn't fall apart during the subsequent processes of steaming and braising. After deep-frying, the duck is placed in a pot to braise, along with the chef's homemade sauce. It is very rare to come across a dish that is prepared using three cooking methods of frying, steaming and braising. The outcome? A sublime dish that is flavourful and satisfying (above).

### FUN FACT

Early Qing Dynasty writer Pu Songling in his account of imperial court cuisine mentions a special duck dish that Emperor Qian Long (1711 – 1799) feasted on. The cavity of the deboned duck was stuffed with a total of eight items such as bamboo shoots, mushroom, chicken, shrimp, sausage and others. This dish came to be known as Eight Treasures Duck.





## Double-boiled Yam Paste Served in Coconut

Yam paste laced with coconut milk and shallot oil and topped with ginkgo nuts is a traditional Chinese dessert enjoyed by many in Singapore. The Teochew 'orh nee' is especially popular as a last course in some restaurants.

At WOK<sup>o</sup>15 Kitchen, this dessert (above) is prepared Hong Kong style, which features water chestnut syrup and water chestnut bits. Chef Chum selects only fresh young yam that's longish in shape.

He says that these particular yams are heavier due to their higher water content, and a lot tastier.

The chef steams the yam with pandan leaves for 20 minutes, and then painstakingly mashes the yam by hand, to achieve a welcome bite and textural contrast. "Machine blended yam paste is very smooth and does not have good mouth-feel," he shares.

The mashed yam is mixed together with sugar, oil and chestnut sauce, and then scooped into a young Thai coconut and double-boiled. The double-boiling process allows the fragrance of the coconut to be infused into the yam paste. The result is a warm, nutty dessert brimming with fragrance. Before serving, the dessert is drizzled with a light and mildly sweet chestnut sauce, which harmonises with the thick and richly-flavoured yam paste. 🍴

## Stewed Beef Brisket

Braised beef brisket, known as ngau lam in Cantonese, is a typical Hong Kong dish cherished for its deep flavours and richness in collagen. This authentic Cantonese dish can be typically found at food stalls (dai pai dongs) around Hong Kong. This dish is simmered for several hours until the brisket is tender and flavourful. Beef tendon and tripe are sometimes added to provide textural contrast to the dish.

The stewed beef brisket (left) is a stand-out dish at WOK<sup>o</sup>15 Kitchen. The chef stir-fries ginger, star anise, cinnamon sticks, orange peel, and other aromatic ingredients together with the brisket. The beef is then braised for three hours with a special sauce comprising a mixture of fermented bean sauce, hoisin sauce, and more. Although this dish is offered paired with noodles in Hong Kong, you can enjoy the succulent beef and glossy sauce with steamed rice too.

### FUN FACT

In Hong Kong, Kau Kee at Gough Street near Central and Sheung Wan is renowned for its beef brisket noodles served with a clear or curry broth. Founded in the 1920s, this small restaurant is a favourite among Hong Kong celebrities including Tony Leung.

### FUN FACT

In ancient China, dessert was only popular on imperial tables. It was only until the Tang Dynasty (618 – 907) and Song Dynasty (960- 1279) that sugar production increased thanks to economic growth in those eras. Sugar eventually became an important flavouring for desserts; prior to that, other sweeteners like honey were used.

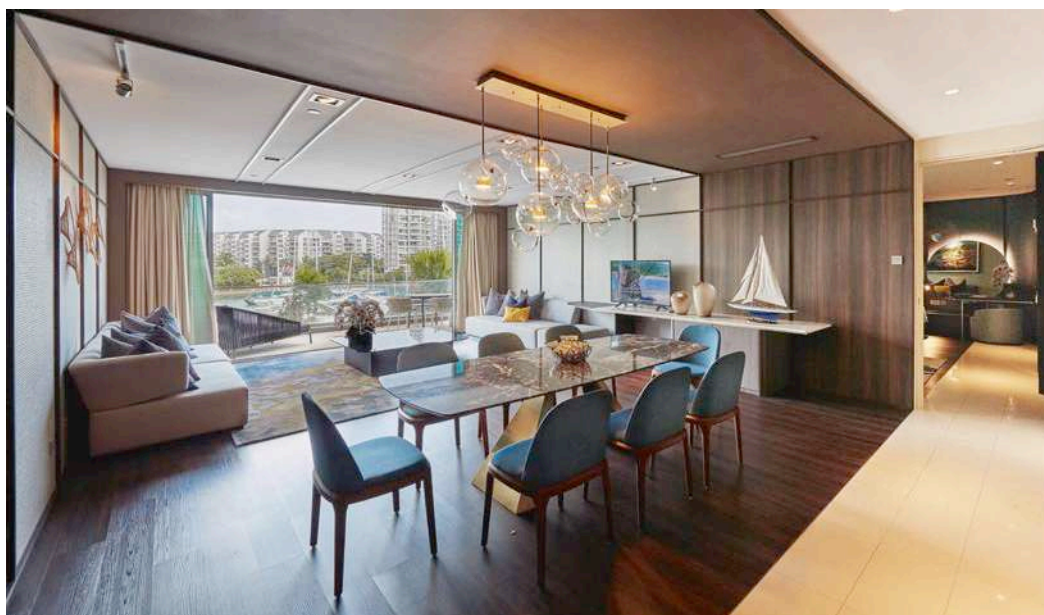

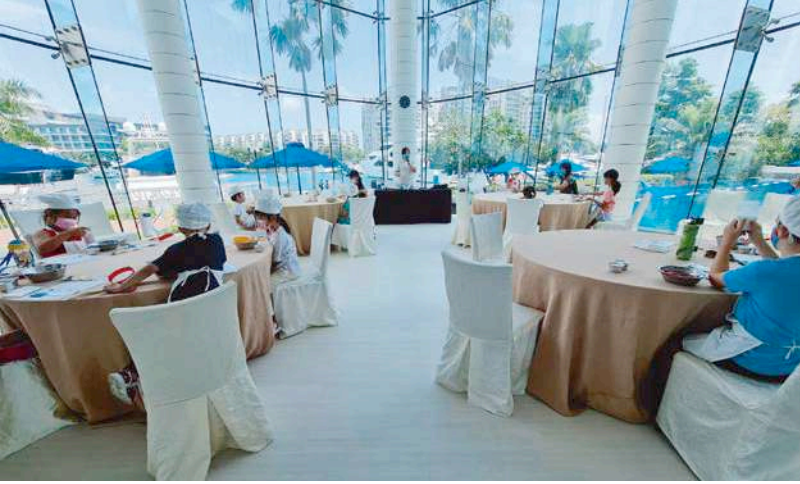
## 28 Hong Kong Street Experience

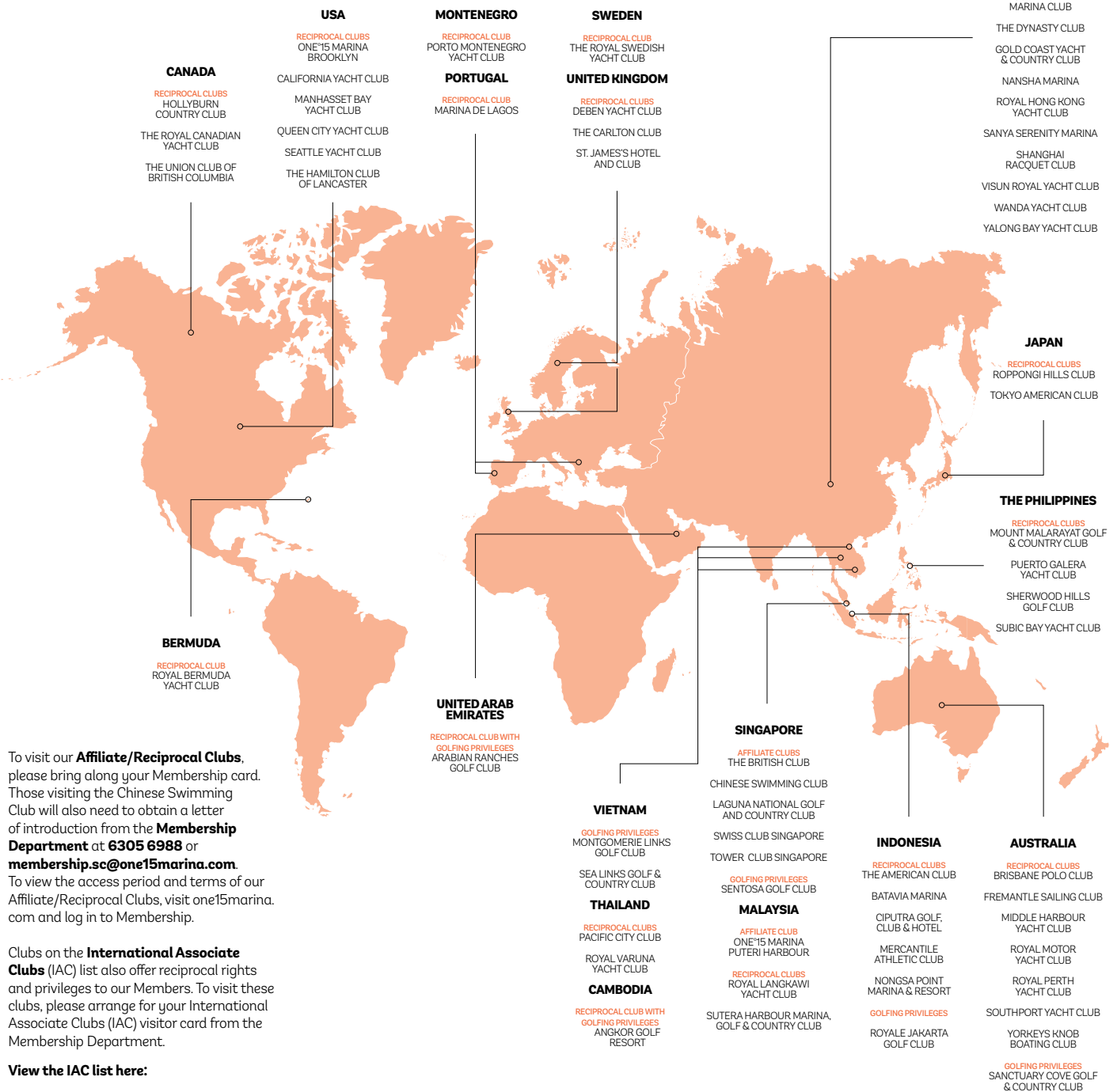
